***MISCELLANEOUS ITEMS**

MISCELLANEOUS ITEMS

At the discretion of security staff, event staff or N.Y.S. law enforcement personnel, any item deemed to be a security risk or disruptive to games activities, or items that pose a risk to public safety, including but not limited to:

- Drugs or other illegal narcotic substances
- Laser Pointers
- Police radios and scanners
- Pressure Cookers
- Aerosol Cans
- Inappropriate clothing with derogatory messages and / or profanity
- Alcoholic beverages (excluding those provided or sold by games vendors or sponsors).

- Unmanned aircraft systems (UAS) – 'drones and quadcopters'
- Roller blades, roller skates, skateboards, hover boards, bicycles, scooters, other than power mobile scooters used by persons with limited mobility.
- Coolers
- Pets (excluding Service Animals)
- Flares, fireworks, pyrotechnics, smoke canisters, signalling devices which emit smoke, dye or flames or any other item or device designed or intended to disrupt games activities as determined by event security, event staff or police.

- Any item that may give cause for concern that the person may wish to demonstrate any political or personal view within any game's venue or location to include articles of clothing, flags, banners, posters, or other items that can be readily completed or altered to create an item that expresses any political or personal view. This includes placards, pens, markers, paints that can be utilized to create an item that expresses any political or personal view deemed to be disruptive to the games
- Drones; any unmanned aerial vehicle (UAV) which is piloted remotely or flies autonomously through the use of software. This restriction does not apply to Law
